1. Expenditure under S137 Local Government Act 1972 and S2 Local Government Act 2000

Section 137(1) of the 1972 Act permits the Council to spend on activities for which it has no other specific powers if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, providing that the benefit is commensurate with the expenditure. Section 137(3) also permits the Council to incur expenditure for certain charitable and other purposes. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2023-24 was £9.93 per elector.

In 2023-24, the Council made payments totalling £ NIL under section 137. These payments are included within 'Other payments' in the Accounting Statement.

Auditor General's report and audit opinion

I certify that I have completed the audit of the Annual Return for the year ended 31 March 2024 of **Llantysilio Community Council**. My audit has been conducted on behalf of the Auditor General for Wales and in accordance with the requirements of the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004 (the 2004 Act) and guidance issued by the Auditor General for Wales.

Audit opinion: Qualified

Except for the matters reported below in my Basis for Qualification, on the basis of my audit, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention to give cause for concern that, in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislative and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

Basis of Qualification

Accounting Statement

I am unable to conclude whether or not the Accounting Statement properly presents the Council's receipts and payments and financial position:

- The comparative accounts for the 2022-23 financial year have been amended from those presented for audit in 2022-23. The accounts presented in this annual return for 2022-23 are arithmetically incorrect.
- The precept reported in the Accounting Statement for 2023-24 differs from that paid by the County Council. The precept actually paid was £11,640.

Other matters and recommendations

I draw the Council's attention to the following matters and recommendations which do not affect my audit opinion but should be addressed by the Council.

Information required for audit

Each year we send to the Council an audit notice that specifies what information is to be provided for audit. This information should be provided in full.

For 2023-24, we requested copies of the Council's Standing Orders and Financial Regulations. The Clerk did not submit these documents but included a letter stating "You will see amongst these that the Council has adopted the 'model Financial Regulations Wales' and the 'Model Standing Orders 2023 (Wales)' which I feel is self-explanatory."

The Clerk did not provide copies of these documents or a link to the Council's website.

Failure to provide the information or a link to where the information can be found on the Council's website means that the audit takes longer than expected and this results in additional audit fees being charged to the Council. Such fees are payable in full by the Council as set out in the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004.

We recommend that before the accounts and supporting information is submitted for audit, the Council checks the completeness of the information by using our audit notice as a checklist.

Approval of accounts

The Accounts and Audit (Wales) Regulations 2014 require the Council to approve the accounts. This means that the approval will require a specific resolution.

The Council's minutes of 3 June 2024 do not clearly record a decision to approve the accounts. Instead the minutes simply state:

"The Chairman signed off the completed Internal Audit as a correct record."

This does not record an approval of the accounts by the Council.

We recommend that the Council properly considers and resolves to approve the annual accounts each year in accordance with the Regulations.

The Chair of the meeting at which the accounts are approved is also required to sign the accounts as evidence of that approval. The annual return simply has the Chair's name typed in. This does not constitute a signature.

Publication of information

The Democracy and Boundary Commission Cymru etc. Act 2013 (the 2013 Act) requires the Council to publish on its website a range of information. While the Council publishes most of the information required it does not publish all of the required information. The missing items include:

- Register of members interests
- Auditor General's report and opinion on certified annual returns

There are no further matters I wish to draw to the Council's attention.
