MINUTES OF A MEETING HELD 4th FEBRUARY 2019

PRESENT

Apologies were received from Cllr. D. Walton and County Cllr. M. Miles.

19/3566 DECLARATION OF INTEREST

There were none.

19/3567 COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Llantysilio Mountain fire

Cllr. Timms informed the Council that the Evidence Gathering Meeting, which was originally scheduled to be held at the Llangollen Pavilion on 21st February, would now be held on the 20th March 2019. He expressed his disappointment that this meeting would not be open to the general public. Representatives from interested groups such as community councils, fire service, police, local businesses etc. would be invited to put a question to the Committee, this question to be submitted to the Committee no later than 12th February, with one representative from each group being allowed to put this question forward on the 20th March. Rise in Council Tax

Cllr. Timms informed the Council that the agreed rise in Council Tax for the coming year would be 6.35%. This excessive rise is due to cuts in services as well as the regular government cuts to local authorities. Services such as education, health, child-care etc, have to be maintained and at a rising cost.

Affordable Housing, Pentredŵr

Cllr. Timms agreed to liaise with the Clerk who will contact Arfon Hughes for an update. <u>Pentrefelin Footpath</u>

Cllr. J. G. Evans asked why the County Council is taking so long in continuing with the Community Council's plan to put a footpath from Vale Crucis Abbey to the Abbey Dingle Nursing Home. Although the original plan had ultimately led to nothing, due to the necessity to implement a compulsory purchase order, in the interim a section of land has been offered, free of charge, to the County Council on the other side of the road.

Cllr. Timms said that, although the Council is grateful to the resident for offering to donate the land, putting the path on the opposite side of the road may not a feasible alternative. Speed limit on the Horseshoe Pass

A contractor has still to be found to undertake the work but the plan now is to place a 60 mph limit from the Pentredŵr junction to the Abbey Grange with 40 mph limit to the cattle-grid. Cllr. Hughes expressed concern that this could lead to more traffic through Pentredŵr.

Illuminated sign at Pentrefelin

The Council expressed its concern that this sign is not only too bright but does not give a clear indication of the weather conditions on the Pass. It was felt that the Council should have been consulted prior to this sign being put in place.

Horseshoe Pass

Cllr. Hughes expressed concern that there weren't enough salt-bins on the Horseshoe Pass.

19/3572 CEMETERY

a) <u>Test holes</u>

Cllr. Mrs Smith has received a written report from Smith Grant Partnership which states that, having undertaken a thorough excavation of 5 trial pits by mini-digger there should be no reason to suppose that the ground at the uphill end of the cemetery will be significantly different. To this end Cllr. J. G. Evans said he would get a price to dig two trial holes.

b) <u>Grit bins</u>

Cllr. Hughes said he would continue looking for second hand grit bins.

c) <u>Wooden rubbish containers</u> Cllr. Mrs Smith said that she would look into getting the rubbish containers repaired.

19/3573 COMMUNITY PROBLEMS

- a) Cllr. Cllr. S. V. Evans said that the filbert tree has been cut down on Llantysilio Green. He asked if the Council could contact whoever owns the roadside fence at Pentrefelin as it is broken and unsightly. He also asked for an update re' Broadband.
- b) Cllr. Hughes asked if a broken roadside metal fence, which is fast becoming concealed by undergrowth, could be removed from Pentredŵr.
